

VISION: The Devon LNP will provide a strong, championing voice for the county's unique and hugely important natural environment. It will embed the value of the high quality natural environment into decision-making processes and improve co-ordination of delivery across Devon, in order to:

- Secure and enhance Devon's intrinsic natural environment and its associated links with the cultural environment; while
- Brokering the optimum economic, social and health benefits that the natural environment can provide for everyone visiting, living or working in Devon.

- **B.** Grow Devon's Green Economy in which economic growth and the health of our natural resources sustain each other.
